Project Title: "Portland's Type Casting Heritage Project, an Oral History."

Summary of project:

The purpose of this project is to document, preserve & present the history of printing through the stories of our community members. *Portland's Type Casting Heritage Project* is an oral history project documenting the era of hot-metal printing in the Portland Metro Area, and is being done in cooperation with the C.C. Stern Type Foundry (a non-profit working museum). Since 2011, I have been interviewing retired printers and type casters regarding their job experiences during the 1950's-1990's.

Report on progress

I have been successful in interviewing four more retired or semiretired type casters & printers since receiving this grant: John Gannon, Bill Washburn, Dennis Gilliam & Ralph Sanders. I hope to complete at least three more within 2016. Additionally, the transcription of two interviews and a panel discussion is nearly complete. I'm looking forward to final review and permissions from the interviewees, then on to the work of getting these oral histories to archives.

I was able to use the micro grant toward the purchase a set of lapel microphones for interviews and also an omni-directional Shure microphone/cable/stand for multiple person recordings. The improvement in sound quality (and associated ease in transcription and editing) is notable. Thank you to the NHN for your support!
